### Congresswoman calls on Navy to assess national security impact of border sewage spills

Washington, D.C. (April 23, 2018) - Rep. Susan Davis (CA-53) plans to enlist the Navy in dealing with the border sewage spills and what kind of impact spills will have on national security. The Navy will build a \$1 billion Navy SEAL training center, known as the coastal campus, down the strand near Imperial Beach. Davis wants an assessment of how construction and future training at the site could be impacted.

"We need a whole of government solution to the sewage spills," said Davis. "We know the environmental and economic impact these spills have. What we don't know, with the Navy planning to stage training operations in potentially contaminated waters, are the national security concerns. The Navy should take a look at this and coordinate with relevant agencies to assess what can be done to prevent future spills."

Davis, a senior member of the House Armed Services Committee, is looking to include language in this year's defense bill to get a report from the Navy on any national security concerns surrounding border sewage spills.

"The Navy's coastal campus will be vital for national security," said Davis. "The last thing we want is our elite Navy SEALs training in water contaminated with sewage. Nor do we want training operations delayed."

The Navy is set to begin construction on a 600-acre Navy SEAL training center along Route 75. Because of sewage spills, Imperial Beach has experienced 160 days of closures to parts of its shoreline over the past three years.

Davis would like the Navy to work with the Department of State, the EPA, the Department of Homeland Security, the International Boundary Water Commission, and the Department of the Interior to assess how our national security will be affected by future spills and how they can be prevented.

# Incoming PACOM chief wants to increase presence near China

DEFENSE NEWS - The nominee to be the next chief of the U.S. forces in the Pacific has called for an increase in U.S. forces from all three services stationed in the vital region, adding that China is now effectively able to control the South China Sea and challenge the U.S. presence in the region.

In his recent testimony at the Senate Armed Services Committee confirmation hearing, Adm. Philip Davidson also said he will work to recalibrate U.S. force posture in the Indo-Pacific region to align with the recently released 2018 National Defense Strategy, an effort he said "entails ensuring the continued combat readiness of assigned forces in the western Pacific (and) developing an updated footprint that accounts for China's rapid modernization."

Davidson, who has been nominated to take over U.S. Pacific Command, or PACOM, also said the strategic and operational environment outlined in the NDS clearly identifies the importance of developing and fielding a force posture that is capable of "countering Chinese malign influence in the region," while describing actions in the South China Sea such as the One Belt One Road

Initiative as China executing its own deliberate and thoughtful force posture initiatives.

Due to the distances involved in the Indo-Pacific, Davidson stressed that the U.S. cannot solely rely on surge forces from the continental United States to deter Chinese aggression or prevent a fait accompli. He also said PACOM must maintain a robust, blunt layer that effectively deters Chinese aggression in the Indo-Pacific.

However, he said there is insufficient forward-deployed and rotational forces from all three services in PACOM's

area of responsibility, or AOR, and the current force structure and presence does "not sufficiently counter the threats in the Indo-Pacific."

He specifically noted that PACOM only has a quarter of its required intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance capability in its AOR, although he declined to go into further details of the ISR shortfall, instead saying "the shortfalls are identified and have been highlighted in PACOM's regular contacts with the Joint Staff."

Additional requirements for the AOR include com-

mand-and-control capabilities, as well as the "integration of long-range, high-speed, lethal, survivable and precision munitions capabilities in ships, submarines, patrol craft, land-based formations,

bombers and fighters." These, combined with robust numbers of fifth-generation platforms and the necessary tankers and transports, will provide U.S. forces an advantage in a denied environment in the near term, the officer explained.

Davidson also touched on the continuing effort to field a new generation of weapons such as the Conventional Prompt Global Strike long-range hypersonic weapons, which he said "will help meet military requirements in PACOM" by expanding the competitive space and by taking on adversaries in areas where the U.S. possesses advantages and adversaries lack strength.

Still, he cautioned that China has already been doing the same by weaponizing space

and improving its ballistic missile technology and cyber capabilities.

The state of follow-on forces to be deployed to the AOR in the event of a conflict was also an area of worry, with Davidson expressing concern about the manning, training

and equipping of U.S. follow-on forces.

He emphasized that continuing resolutions, delayed appropriations and sequestration stemming from the budget impasse directly impacts the size and speed of a military response.

## Evidence of normal life returns to Iraq, Syria, after 'caliphate' defeat, official says

WASHINGTON - Although hard work remains following defeat of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria's tyrannical self-proclaimed caliphate in Iraq and Syria, there are encouraging signs that life is returning to normal, the spokesman for Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve told Pentagon reporters April 24.

On March 21, various groups across Iraq and Syria - including Assyrians, Yezidis and Kurds - celebrated Nowruz, the beginning of the Persian new year, free from ISIS, for the first time in years, Army Col. Ryan S. Dillon said from Baghdad.

"In Mosul, the United Arab Emirates - a valued partner in the coalition - pledged to assist Iraq in reconstructing the Nuri Mosque and the Hadba minaret, which ISIS destroyed as it withdrew further into the city in June of last year," Dillon said.

Iraqi security forces continue to provide the security that enables stability necessary for rebuilding and reconstruction, he added, noting that the U.S.-led coalition will continue to conduct operations that limit ISIS' freedom of movement and constrain their ability to build forces.

In Syria in over the past week, the coalition conducted 14 strikes against ISIS terrorist fighters and defensive fighting positions. Additionally, the Syrian Democratic Forces recently announced the capture of Mohammed Haydar Zammar, a Syrian-born German national who worked as an ISIS recruiter, the spokesman noted.

"The Syrian Democratic Forces continue to prove they are a capable force, defeating ISIS throughout most of north and eastern Syria, but also detaining hundreds of foreign terrorist fighters," Dillon said.

Terrorist fighters in the region are attempting to sneak away to establish new safe havens or return to their home countries to recruit, plot and execute attacks, he said, adding that these terrorists' tradecraft, passports and relationships represent a global threat to the civilized world.

"The SDF are denying ISIS the ability to do this," Dillon said.

Also denying ISIS the ability to come back to liberated areas, the Raqqa Internal Security Forces continue to grow, im-

prove and provide Raqqawis with security, he noted. The U.S.-led coalition has trained many of the security forces on the law of armed conflict, weapons familiarization, first aid and awareness of techniques to counter improvised explosive devices.

The security forces are subordinate to the Raqqa Civil Council, a local body that is representative of Raqqawis and responsive to their needs, Dillon explained, adding that April 19 marked the first anniversary of the council's formation. The

One such initiative is the restoration of the region's canal system, restoring water to

## Mattis welcomes Japanese counterpart, discusses regional security

WASHINGTON - Defense Secretary James N. Mattis met with Defense Minister Itsunori Onodera of Japan at the Pentagon April 20.

In a statement summarizing the meeting, Pentagon officials said the two leaders discussed ways to further strengthen the U.S.-Japan alliance, and positively noting the increasing role the Japan Self-Defense Force is playing in regional security, including supporting the United Nations Security Council Resolution enforcement and mutual asset protection operations.

Recognizing the threat posed by North Korea's unlawful nuclear and missile programs, Mattis and Onodera affirmed the importance of close cooperation among the U.S., Japan, South Korea and other like-minded nations in providing credible military backing to the maximum pressure campaign, the statement said.

In addition, the men agreed to continue enhancing the alliance capability to deter and respond to any North Korean aggression, the statement said.

Mattis also discussed the recently released U.S. National Defense Strategy, and welcomed Japan's determination to similarly review its National Defense Program Guidelines by the end of this year, the statement said.

Both leaders reaffirmed the importance of continued progress on the realignment of U.S. forces in Japan, including recent efforts to realize the permanent location for a field carrier landing facility, the statement said.

# Cloud data to give warfighters edge to 'dominate' in battlefield, DoD official says

WASHINGTON - The Defense Department's enterprise-wide cloud solution will give warfighters the information they need at speed, providing the critical battlefield advantage in the wars of tomorrow, DoD officials told reporters April 23.

"It's about data," DoD Chief Management Officer John Gibson II said at a Pentagon roundtable.

The warfighters' accessibility to data, timeliness of that information and the security of the data, along with the ability to use that data for machine learning and artificial capabilities, will give the competitive edge in the

wars of tomorrow, he said.

That will allow the warfighters to "dominate in the battlefield," he said.

The first priority of Defense Secretary James N. Mattis is to increase lethality, Gibson

the practice of using a network of remote servers hosted on the Internet to store, manage, and process data, rather than a local server or a personal computer.

pointed out. "We see this effort as doing just that," he said.

Machine learning and being

able to process data at machine speeds will be critical components in the wars of tomorrow, said Robert Daigle, director of cost analysis and program evaluation in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. "Arguably, it is a critical component of how the warfighters of today should be fighting, if they had the capabilities," Daigle said.

The best solution for the department is to have a single cloud solution, he said. Multiple cloud solutions would add to the number of people involved in the

process, demand increased security measures, cost more than a single cloud solution, and hinder warfighters through the added time and layers in the bureaucratic process, he explained.

The wars of tomorrow will center on the ability to process massive amounts of data at machine-learning speeds, he said. "Anything that detracts from that is a degradation in the capability that the department is providing to the warfighter," he added.

## JEDI contract

Known as the Joint Enterprise Defense Infrastructure, or JEDI, Cloud, the planned contracting action is a full and open competition. It is a two-year contract with two option periods – for five years and then three – for a potential 10-year contract, Daigle explained.

"The whole reason we're engaging in this is all about enabling tomorrow's warfighter to operate at speed," he said. "Whoever can process the information more quickly tomorrow has an advantage on the battlefield."

The draft DoD JEDI Cloud request for proposals went live following a March 7 industry day. The final request for proposals is expected to be released in May, with an award in fiscal year 2018, DoD officials have said.

## National military briefs

**DoD seeks to make civilian agencies more productive, efficient ...** WASHINGTON - The Defense Department is already looking at ways to make its agencies more productive and efficient, the deputy defense secretary told the Defense Writers Group here April 24.

Patrick M. Shanahan welcomed House Armed Services Committee Chairman Rep. Mac Thornberry's interest in the so-called Fourth Estate. The Texas representative has issued "discussion drafts" of legislation that calls for elimination of some organizations and reforms of others.

Thornberry defines the Fourth Estate as civilian-dominated military agencies such as the Defense Contract Audit Agency, the Defense Information Systems Agency or the Defense Logistics Agency.

## Army secretary, senior NCO discuss retention, modernization

**... WASHINGTON** - Quality trumps quantity when it comes to soldiers, Army Secretary Mark Esper told reporters here this week.

Esper and Sergeant Major of the Army Daniel Dailey briefed reporters on recruiting, retention and equipment during the Pentagon news gaggle.

The Army is addressing readiness issues, the secretary said, but it is still the most potent fighting force in the world. "If we got the call today, the Army would deploy, fight and win in any conflict,"

Esper said. "I am completely confident of that."

Readiness in the service is trending up, he said, and if the promised levels of funding continue "and demand remains stable, we'll be in good shape," he said.

The Army is growing and accessions to the service are strong. "Quality remains number one, we are not lowering standards in any way, shape or form, to meet recruiting numbers," Esper said. Officials up and down the command chain and in the Army Recruiting Command understand that message.


## US, Thailand kick-off anti-submarine exercise

**Guardian Sea** ... ANDAMAN SEA - The Navy and Royal Thai Navy kicked off exercise Guardian Sea in the Andaman Sea April 25.

The five-day anti-submarine and maritime domain awareness exercise will involve cooperative evolutions designed to enhance mutual capabilities in anti-submarine warfare while also improving information sharing between the two navies.

USS *Halsey* (DDG-97), a fast attack submarine and a P-8 Poseidon are participating from the U.S. Navy. Participating assets from the RTN include helicopter carrier HTMS Chakri Naruebet, Khamronsin-class corvette HTMS Long Lom, Naresuan-class frigate HTMS Taksin and HTMS Naresuan, and S-70B Seahawk helicopter.

"Guardian Sea is an increasingly sophisticated and robust exercise that enables the U.S. Navy and Royal Thai Navy to continue working closely together and learning from each other," said Capt. Lex Walker, commander of Destroyer Squadron 7. "Each year, as allies, our two nations are becoming increasingly capable in mutually conducting anti-submarine warfare that ensures security and stability in the maritime domain."

## Social Security Matters

### Ask Rusty - Turning 70 and still working: What about Social Security?

*Dear Rusty: I turn 70 on March 13, 2018 and I'm single. I was told to apply for Social Security one month before I turn 70, but now I'm hearing that I should have applied 4 months in advance. I have also been told not to apply for Social Security because I plan on still working. I think this is not right, but thought I'd ask anyway. I plan on working after 70 and I'm wondering what happens to the Medicare and Social Security deductions. Are they still deducted? Any other hints would be appreciated. Signed: 70 but Still Kicking*

*Dear Still Kicking: I'm happy to be able to clarify these things for you. The Social Security Administration recommends that you apply for your benefits up to 3 months before you want them to start, but you won't lose anything because you didn't. Just be sure you specify in your application that you want your "Benefit Start Month" to be March 2018. They will make sure your benefits start for that month, even if they must pay you retroactively.*

Working after your benefits start will not affect your Social Security payments in any way. Social Security's annual "earnings limit" goes away once a person reaches their full retirement age, which in your case was age 66. So now at age 70, you can earn as much as you like and your benefits won't be reduced as they might normally be for someone who had not yet reached their full retirement age. But if you continue to work, even though you are on Medicare and collecting Social Security, FICA taxes (which include both Medicare and Social Security contributions) will continue to be withheld from your earnings. There is no exemption because you are already on Medicare or receiving Social Security benefits, nor because you've attained a certain age.

By claiming your benefits at age 70, your Social Security check will be 32 percent higher than it would have been at age 66. Please be aware also that depending on your income level, some of your Social Security benefits may be taxable income when you file your Federal taxes. As a single filer, if your "combined income", also known as your Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI), exceeds \$25,000 then up to 50 percent of your benefits may be taxable; if your MAGI exceeds \$34,000 up to 85 percent of your benefits may be taxable. To clarify, your "combined income" includes your regular Adjusted Gross Income for income tax purposes, plus 50 percent of your Social Security income, plus any non-taxable interest you received but did not need to claim on your IRS Form 1040. You should include this potential additional tax obligation in your thinking as you consider your income tax situation.

## Sailors, Coast Guardsmen remember Firebolt shipmates

MANAMA, Bahrain (NNS) -- Sailors and Coast Guardsmen gathered for a wreath laying memorial service and 5k run at Naval Support Activity Bahrain April 24 to remember and honor their fallen shipmates who made the ultimate sacrifice 14 years ago.

The service honored Coast Guardsman Damage Controlman 3rd Class Nathan B. Bruckenthal, Navy Signalman 2nd Class Christopher E. Watts and Navy Boatswain's Mate 1st Class Michael J. Pernaselli who perished while conducting maritime security operations in the Northern Arabian Gulf April 24, 2004.

Coast Guard Patrol Forces Southwest Asia (PATFORSWA) Commodore, Capt. Clinton Carlson was the guest speaker and spoke to the service and dedication of the men who lost their lives.

"At the time, I was a young lieutenant, assigned to Port Security unit 311 in San Pedro, California," he said. "For the 311 Sailors, the attack was personal. This was family, and for me it was one of those days that I will always remember where I was because my Coast Guard, and the nature of my service had changed forever."

On April 24, 2004, Firebolt

was in the vicinity of the Khawr Al Amaya Oil Terminal in Iraq, with the mission of defending the terminal against attack. A suspicious dhow was spotted nearby, and Firebolt deployed a rigid-hull inflatable boat (RHIB) manned by six Sailors and a U.S. Coast Guardsman to investigate the vessel. The dhow, realizing the RHIB was in pursuit, sped toward the oil terminal. The RHIB maneuvered into position to intercept the vessel, but the dhow exploded in an apparent suicide attack. Minutes later, two other dhows exploded prematurely in what was an attempted coordinated attack on Iraq's offshore oil infrastructure.

Though the crew of the RHIB had successfully protected the oil platform, the wake created by the explosions capsized the small boat, claiming the lives Pernaselli, Watts and Bruckenthal, who was the first Coast Guardsman to die in action since the Vietnam War.

The commanding officer of Firebolt, Lt. Cmdr. Roger Young, also gave remarks, stressing the sacrifice the service members made for their shipmates.

"I am pleased to report that the memory of our shipmates has not been forgotten and their sacrifice likely spared the lives of countless other Sailors onboard every warship that sailed the Arabian Gulf," said Young. "Their sacrifice serves as a reminder that the

threat we face is real and that no mission is routine."

The memorial honoring the legacies of these service members stands across the courtyard from the PATFORSWA headquarters, and features the service members' rating badges, a folded flag and a life ring from Firebolt.

This year's memorial service holds particular significance for the Coast Guard, as they took delivery of the USCGC Nathan Bruckenthal, a 154-foot patrol craft, in March 2018.

"Their devotion to duty and selfless sacrifice continue to serve as shining examples to

all of us who strive to make the world more secure," said Carlson. "They remind us that no mission is routine and that true security has been hard-earned through challenging naval operations among U.S. and allied forces through the years."

friend and her family that didn't isolate him and we all became fast friends. Unfortunately she is PCSing in a few months and her mother is telling us that she is now being isolated by her friends," says Navy spouse Jay of his son, age 10.

"My son decided not to play baseball this spring, his sophomore year," says Army wife Kimberly. "We're moving to Rhode Island, and here in Alaska the season is just starting, snow is still covering the fields. He didn't want to train on a team when he wouldn't get to be there for part of the season. He felt

he'd be letting the team down."

Marine child Gabby, age nine, describes her most stressful move as leaving Okinawa, Japan in fourth grade, "because we had an entire life there with friends away from all family," and, "it was one of the longest duty stations I've been alive for."

"While I was excited to start middle school in Virginia, I quickly figured out that these kids had gone to school with each other since kindergarten," recalls Navy dependent Adrienne D., now age 20. "This was a new concept that these kids have known each other their whole lives. I found it very difficult to find friends within the first year of moving."

of Defense, there are 1.7 million American force-dependent children across the globe, about 80 percent of which attend public schools. Since over half of all military moves take place at the end of the school year, there are roughly a million military kids currently facing an impending move. That makes April, the Month of the Military Child, pretty stressful.

According to the authors of a new book available June 1, *The Seasons of My Military Child: Practical Ideas for Parents and Teachers*, parents and educators should use a team-approach to help military kids through transitions. Authors Amanda Trimillos, Air Force spouse, teacher,

such as creating an "Education Binder" that follows your child to each school — the authors say military children can thrive.

Even social media can be an effective tool in easing transition stress, according to Trimillos, whose daughter still plays Barbies with her best friend from three stations ago via FaceTime. "She sets her screen inside her Barbie house while her friend does the same in Oklahoma."

Our own daughters developed a way to turn fear into positive

excitement after our move to Germany in 2008. Anna would point out forests, playgrounds, sidewalks ... anything, and proclaim conspiratorially to her little sister, Lilly, "Adventure awaits!"

"Military kids have tried and failed, tried and succeeded.... and live to tell about it," Allsbrook-Huisman says, acknowledging that military children are more experienced than civilian peers. "It's the gift of perspective, something only military kids have."

"It was stressful just knowing everything was happening at once. Moving away from my comfortable place and having to start fresh. Knowing that the friends I do make will only be for a short time," says Navy child Aliyah, age 8.

Adrienne G., Navy spouse, explains how her two boys react differently to change: "I have an extrovert who wants to spend more time with friends and an introvert who wants to pull away. To meet the needs of both kids, we're staying in one state. The Navy can survive without us for a while."

According to the Department

and mother of four, and Stacy Allsbrook-Huisman, Air Force spouse, military advocate, and mother of two, advise parents to build an "army of awareness." Together, parents, teachers, administrators, and counselors can guide the child through the "seasons of transition."

The team should watch for signs of struggle, which include isolation, low grades, eating alone at lunch, and lack of involvement. Trimillos and Allsbrook-Huisman recommend that parents listen. "Let them lead the conversation, especially tweens and teens. Ask open-ended questions. 2) Love is not deleting your humanity. Love includes acknowledging all your anger, grief, and fear and having the impulse control to act well even when you feel bad.





PORLAND, Ore. - More than 100 Sailors assigned to the future USS Portland (LPD 27) engaged with the community by volunteering, April 16 through April 18, in the ship's namesake city.

Portland is the 11th San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock ship built by Huntington Ingalls Industries. It is the third ship to bear the name USS Portland; however, it is the first ship to be named solely for Oregon's largest city.

Amphibious transport dock ships are versatile players in maritime security, with the ability to support a variety of amphibious assault, special operations or expeditionary warfare missions, operating independently or as part of amphibious readiness group, expeditionary strike groups, or joint task forces. In addition to performing the primary mission, the San Antonio-class ships are able to support anti-piracy operations, and provide humanitarian assistance and foreign disaster relief operations around the world.

## Commander, Surface Division ELEVEN established

SAN DIEGO - While Commander, Surface Division ELEVEN (COMSURFACEDIV 11) has been operating as an official command since March 9, a formal ceremony was held Apr. 20 to formally recognize the new command structure in front of LCS leaders, Sailors and regional supporting personnel.

"Today marks a major step forward for the littoral combat ship program in terms of readiness generation and operational capability," said Capt. John Fay, commodore, COMSURFACEDIV 11 and a native of Scarborough, Maine. "Standing up the Surface Division is the start of a new chapter in LCS history where we will focus on a common mission set for a group of ships in order to deploy ready, capable, and tactically proficient LCSs in support of fleet operations."

The new division commands seven LCS crews and four ships - including USS Jackson (LCS 6), USS Montgomery (LCS 8), USS Gabrielle Giffords (LCS 10) and USS Omaha (LCS 12).

The new command and control architecture is intended to simplify organizational processes by streamlining the chain of command for LCS. The initiative began after the release of the recommendations of the CNO-directed 60-day review in Feb-

ruary 2016. Formerly, a single commodore at COMLCSRON ONE managed nearly 30 crews and upwards of 10 separate hulls - a command structure deemed to be too flat and inconsistent with the rest of the Navy.

"This is another pivotal point in the LCS community as we stand up this division," said Capt. Matthew McGonigle, commodore, COMLCSRON ONE and a native of Turnersville, New Jersey. "A lot of work has been done by a number of people these past two years to establish this division, and it's a real pleasure to see their work come to fruition and the new division come to life."

This division is the first of the LCS fleet to be designated with a specific warfare focus. As more LCSs are commissioned, mine warfare and anti-submarine warfare divisions will also be established. Each division will be led by an O-6 level commander.

COMLCSRON ONE will remain involved with the three divisions, maintaining operational control, and also command four test ships - USS Freedom (LCS 1), USS Independence (LCS 2), USS Fort Worth (LCS 3) and USS Coronado (LCS 4). This new structure allows the divisions to focus on operational and overall readiness of the hulls,

# Navy commissions amphibious transport dock ship Portland

## Portland commissioned in namesake city

PORTLAND, Ore. - As medals adorning their chests clang with each running step, Sailors rush past the brow to man their vessel.

During an official commissioning ceremony held in front of more than 5,000 guests, the crew of USS Portland (LPD 27) brought their ship to life in Portland, Oregon, April 21.

The Hon. Patrick Shanahan, deputy secretary of defense, officially placed Portland in commission, the 11th San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock to join the Navy's operational fleet.

"The City of Roses has a ship worthy of its creative spirit and industrious heritage," proclaimed Shanahan. "The acceptance trials are over and her officers and crew are ready. Wherever her flag flies,

in foreign ports, on the high seas, in weather fair or foul, this ship will carry the spirit of this city on the Columbia River."

While addressing the audience, Shanahan emphasized the importance behind the naming of the Portland, while touching upon the history of the first two ships to carry the name "Portland."

"This is the first ship to be named exclusively for Portland, Oregon," said Shanahan. "Her officers and crew will write the next chapter, and do so with pride. This ship will carry our power and goodwill anywhere they are needed."

Since departing Pascagoula, Mississippi, the ship and her crew have sailed 9,930 nautical miles, conducted a line-crossing ceremony, and sailed through the historic Panama Canal on their way to their designated homeport of San Diego.

"Since December 1775,

commissioning ceremonies have been an honored naval tradition celebrating, accepting, and welcoming a new ship into the fleet," said Capt. J.R. Hill, Portland's commanding officer. "When USS Portland was brought to life during today's ceremony, I was humbled as I thought back to the dedication and passion the crew demonstrated throughout our journey to this culminating moment."

Speaking on behalf of Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. John Richardson, Deputy CNO Vice Adm. Dixon Smith went down memory lane, recalling the history of the Oregon Shipyard, which during the height of World War II launched 24 ships in only 30 days.

"USS Portland has joined the ever-growing list of reasons for Portlanders to be proud," said Smith. "The men and women of this crew come from all across the nation and will soon sail, perhaps into harm's way, to keep us safe here at home."

Upon conclusion of the ceremony, guests were invited to tour the 684-foot warfighting vessel, where they could

experience the state-of-the-art design that will continue to sail decades from today with future generations of Sailors and Marines aboard.

"Portland's motto, 'First Responders, Brave and Determined' made having the ceremony in Portland - with the city's first responders present - even more meaningful for all in attendance," said Hill.

Prior to commissioning, Portland underwent multiple phases to prepare her join the fleet.

The ship's formal recognition of transition from concept to reality began Aug. 2,

engraved her name upon a plaque as a symbol authenticating the keel.

A mast-stepping ceremony was then held May 20, 2016. The time-honored naval tradition symbolized the moment a shell became a ship, and her crew honored that tradition by placing mementos into a time capsule for future Portland Sailors to discover.

Portland was officially launched May 21, 2016, after a ceremonial christening Feb. 13, 2016.

Today, Portland boasts a heavy arsenal of capabilities beneath the hood.

LIMA, Peru - Sailors from USS Lake Champlain (CG 57) anchored off the coast of Lima, Peru, April 23, after completing a combined anti-submarine training exercise with Peru and Colombia.

"My crew and I are absolutely thrilled to have the unique opportunity to participate in SIFOREX and visit Peru," said Capt. Jennifer Ellinger, Lake Champlain's commanding officer. "I participated in SIFOREX 2004 and have been very impressed by how the exercise has continued to evolve, while providing a challenging and equally rewarding training environment."

In addition to practicing anti-submarine warfare, participants also trained in communication, joint maneuvers, maritime helicopter operations, air defense, gunnery exercises, boarding operations, and search and rescue.

Two Peruvian naval officers embarked Lake Champlain to observe the exercise and said the experience left a good impression on them.

"The crew on board, all of them are very good at the job that they have to do and each one of them knows that they are in an important event in SIFOREX," said Lt. j.g. Jean Pierre Perez, one of the embarked Peruvian officers. "They have been very kind with us, from the captain to the last enlisted man."

# Navy accepts delivery of future USS Michael Monsoor

BATH, Maine - The Navy accepted hull, mechanical and electrical (HM&E) delivery of the future USS Michael Monsoor (DDG 1001) from shipbuilder General Dynamics Bath Iron Works (BIW) April 24.

Delivery of DDG 1001 follows extensive tests, trials and demonstrations of the ship's HM&E systems, including the boat handling, anchor and mooring systems as well as major demonstrations of the damage control, ballasting, navigation and communications systems.

"Delivery of DDG 1001 marks the culmination of years of dedication and hard work from our Navy and industry team," said Capt. Kevin Smith, DDG 1000 program manager, Program Executive Office, Ships. "We have incorporated many lessons learned from DDG 1000 and are proud of the end result. DDG 1001 will be a tremendous asset to the Navy."

The 610-foot, wave-piercing tumblehome ship design provides a wide array of advancements. The shape of the superstructure and the arrangement of its antennas significantly reduce radar cross section, making the ship less visible to enemy radars.

Like the first ship of the class, USS Zumwalt (DDG 1000), DDG 1001 employs an innovative and highly survivable integrated power system (IPS), distributing 1,000 volts of direct current across the ship. The IPS's unique archi-

tectural capabilities include the ability to allocate all 78 megawatts of installed power to propulsion, ship's service and combat system loads from the same gas turbine prime movers based on operational requirements.

Michael Monsoor will transit to its homeport in San Diego for commissioning in January 2019 and to begin combat systems activation, testing and trials.

DDG 1001 is the second ship of the Zumwalt class. The third and final ship of the class, the future USS Lyndon B. Johnson (DDG 1002), is currently in construction at BIW's shipyard along with Arleigh Burke-class destroyers Daniel Inouye (DDG 118), Carl M. Levin

(DDG 120) and John Basilone (DDG 122).

As one of the Defense Department's largest acquisition organizations, PEO Ships is responsible for executing the development and procurement of all destroyers, amphibious ships, special mission and support ships and special warfare craft.

# USS Coronado completes operational testing of new mine detection system

SAN DIEGO - USS *Coronado* (LCS 4) successfully completed operational testing of the Coastal Battlefield Reconnaissance and Analysis (COBRA) System, Apr. 6.

This second phase of testing for *Coronado*, which began shortly after completion of developmental testing, Feb. 22, involved in port and underway operations with support from Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron 21 and Mine Countermeasure Detachment 6.

"The crew onboard was the perfect fit to conduct this testing," said Danny Lunden, test director for Mine Countermeasure Mission Package, Naval Surface Warfare Center, Port Hueneme Division. "We all worked so well together and did so in such a short amount of time."

The operational testing included identifying possible landing zones for amphibious forces, detecting mines, and locating obstacles that would prevent forces from entering mission critical areas.

"It is incredible how all three different entities came together to accomplish this mission,"

said Cmdr. Karl McCarthy, *Coronado*'s commanding officer. "It took an ample amount of time, dedication and teamwork from all parties to make this successful."

Personnel used both an MQ-8B Fire Scout and a MH-60 Sierra to process information and plan beach zone operations. As well, the testing required an upgrade to the Fire Scout and Mission Package Computing Environment to support the coastal mine reconnaissance missions.

"We worked diligently to prepare for COBRA operational testing," said Lt. Cmdr. James

Gelsinon, aviation detachment officer in charge. "The lessons learned during developmental testing and the close relationship with the crew were key to our success."

Designated LCS testing ships, of which *Coronado* is one, are single-crewed and focus solely on testing hardware, software and concepts of operations for specific mission modules in order to develop the best tactics and doctrine within each ship's specified warfare area.

Sailors assigned to the test ships say they are excited to be part of shaping the future of LCS.

"This was an incredible and ground-breaking experience for myself and the mission package

detachment," said Chief Mine-man Lindsey Wolghemuth, mine detachment chief petty officer. "We get to see how LCS can not only rapidly respond, but how diverse each mission can be on each platform."

LCS is a high-speed, agile, shallow draft, focused-mission surface combatant designed for operations in the littoral environment, yet fully capable of open ocean operations. As part of the surface fleet, LCS has the ability to counter and outpace evolving threats independently or within a network of surface combatants. Paired with advanced sonar and mine hunting capabilities, LCS provides a major contribution, as well as a variety of options for fleet commanders, across the spectrum of operations.

# VARIETY 'Ready Player One' proves Steven Spielberg can still deliver a blockbuster

Steven Spielberg enjoyed his best opening in a decade with "Ready Player One."

The virtual reality fantasy released with a healthy \$53 million at the North American box office and picked up an additional \$128 million overseas, bringing its global total to \$181.2 million. That was enough to land the director of "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" and "Jurassic Park" his biggest debut since "Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull" launched in 2008 with \$100 million.

As for his last popcorn movie that wasn't already part of a multi-million dollar franchise? That would be another novel-turned-big screen event, 2005's "War of the Worlds," which premiered with \$64 million. That

alien invasion flick got a boost from Tom Cruise's star power (though his Oprah couch jumping did lead to some unwelcome pre-release publicity).

Recent projects have highlighted a different side of Spielberg, with the Oscar-winning filmmaker devoting much of his energy to historical dramas geared toward adults, such as "The Post," "Lincoln," and "War Horse." And while his movies aren't breaking records like they once did with "Jaws," "Jurassic Park," and "E.T.," as of now, Spielberg seems to be in good shape after a couple of embarrassing box office bombs.

Spielberg's last few big-budget films, both targeted at family auds - 2016's "The BFG" and 2011's "The Adventures of Tintin" - didn't land with

moviegoers, but analysts point to "Ready Player One" as a reaffirmation of the commercial credentials of a man whose name is synonymous with the modern day blockbuster. After all, he basically created the concept of the summer escapist fantasy with 1975's "Jaws."

"It put Spielberg right back in his sweet spot," Paul Dergarabedian, an analyst at comScore, said. "He was one of the architects of the summer movie season. It shows that when Spielberg goes back to what people loved about him in the first place, it really pays off big."

"Ready Player One," based on the Ernest Cline novel, plays like something of an '80s' greatest hits compilation. Its virtual reality setting allows Spielberg to stuff the film with nods to such

Reagan-era staples as "Back to the Future" and "Nightmare on Elm Street." Audiences seem to be hungry for what could be considered Spielberg's bread and butter - the family-oriented sci-fi epic.

"This takes him back to his early days where he was focused on driving younger moviegoers to the movies," Dergarabedian said. "We shouldn't be surprised younger moviegoers have gravitated toward the film, but older audiences as well, who grew up on Spielberg movies."

The brand familiarity of Spielberg, bolstered by a generally positive critical consensus, will continue to drive interest, Dergarabedian said.

"This is Spielberg doing what Spielberg does best," he added. "Now people will come out in bigger numbers who are hearing about it and reading about it and seeing the positive social media sentiment."

And it'll help that R-rated comedy "Blockers" and fast-paced thriller "A Quiet Place," both aiming for strong openings

next weekend, don't completely overlap with "Ready Player One's" target audience. That leaves about a month until the next potential blockbuster - "Avengers: Infinity War." Dergarabedian points to that duration between all ages-fare as a win

for Spielberg and company.

"In this marketplace, if you have a wide open playing field, that's a luxury that most movies don't get," he said. "This is a good thing. The playability will be there."



The conflict in "Avengers: Infinity War" is on a galactic scale. The spectacle is enormous. When you blink you might miss something.

Thanos is a villain unlike any other, and he is on a rampage. The sheer magnitude of the challenge confronting the Avengers calls for a massive response from

the greatest number of Avengers we've ever seen together. The assembled team includes Tony Stark/Iron Man, Thor, Bruce Banner/The Hulk, Steve Rogers/Captain America, Natasha Romanoff/Black Widow, Colonel James Rhodes/War

Machine, Doctor Strange, Peter Parker/Spiderman, T'Challa/Black Panther and Gamora, as well as Nebula, Loki, Vision, Wanda Maximoff/Scarlet Witch, Sam Wilson/Falcon, Bucky Barnes/Winter Soldier, Heimdall, Okoye, Wong, Mantis, Drax, Groot, Rocket and Peter Quill/Star-Lord. Also making appearances are Pepper Potts, The Collector and, in his ever present cameo, the great Stan Lee. You got all that?

If, therefore, we measure getting what we come to see in Avengers movies by the overwhelming number of superheroes present, "Avengers: Infinity War" delivers in a very big way – but to what end?

The well-rounded, nuanced characters have depth and flaws, and stir the gamut of our emotions. Their motivations are thought provoking. It can be argued that the most seemingly evil acts are perhaps rationally

motivated, opening this film up to heated critical debate and controversy, as alluded to earlier.

Just as the number of Avengers seen here is record-breaking, so too may be the number of people listed in the closing credits. The tremendous volume of computer-generated effects and animation was a massive undertaking.

Speaking of the credits, do stay until the very end. There is a bonus scene and it is important.

STARTING THIS WEEK: "12 STRONG": Chris Hemsworth and Michael Shannon star in the true story of the first U.S. soldiers who entered Afghanistan after the 9/11 attacks. Though the tale is well-known now, at the time, the officers faced much uncertainty as they tried to sway foreign troops to join their effort against the Taliban and al-Qaeda. A big divide was created by the quality of the respective forces' armaments, merging the most current instruments of warfare with the somewhat primitive firepower of overseas allies. Those poltergeists have taken refuge in her mansion, but she can't convince others of that. In fact, the board members of the rifle company think she's lost her mind, so they enlist a doctor (Jason Clarke) to go to the mansion and determine her level of sanity. "TREMORS: A COLD DAY IN HELL": The horror-with-humor franchise that home video has kept alive keeps going with this newest entry, returning Michael Gross ("Family Ties") to the role of Burt Gummer, the survivalist who heads to the coldest reaches of Canada with his son (fellow returnee Jamie Kennedy) to track more giant worms. When Burt is affected by the venom of one of them, the mission takes on added urgency. Action specialist (and sometimes actor) Don Michael Paul directed the tale. ### Dear Cathy,

I have a four-year-old American short-hair female cat. I got her at 8 weeks old from a friend. The problem is, she scratches my upholstered furniture and rugs. She only does it when I am in the room. I have tried sprays, tape and correcting with a spritz of water. I have various scratching posts, which she is not interested in, even when I put catnip on them. Putting towels over things helps a bit, but she usually finds a way around them. Any other ideas? - Carol, via email

### Dear Carol,

Scratching and clawing are natural instincts for a cat or kitten, and with indoor cats, our furniture and rugs become their items of choice for sharpening their claws and leaving their scent behind. The fact that she only does it when you're in the room makes it a little easier for you to correct.

Get some foam or pom-pom cat balls or crumple paper or aluminum foil into balls and have them ready to toss across the room when you enter. Her first

reaction should be to chase the ball and not scratch in response to your arrival in the room. She still may eventually scratch, but now you can correct her quicker with a verbal "eh-eh" or a Pet Corrector, which emits a compressed air sound, to discourage her from scratching in inappropriate areas. It's important to not just correct her but show her alternative places to scratch. Put treats, food pieces, cat nip, or cat grass she can eat, near or on scratching posts and cat trees to attract her to her furniture.

Be consistent with your distraction/attraction techniques, and over time, she will learn what is expected of her.

### Dear Frank,

what's acceptable to put in their mouths.

Don't use your hands or arms to play with her, and never punish her for this normal behavior. Instead, correct her and offer her toys to teeth on instead.

When she sinks her teeth into you, give a short "yelp" to interrupt the behavior and then say, "let go." Praise her and give her a treat if she lets go. Some training experts say you should go "quiet" because prey also yelps when you bite. But, I have found this usually does not work for a puppy who is wired at this age to listen.

If she doesn't let go, shake a can of coins or purchase a Pet Corrector, which emits a compressed air sound, to get her attention. If this still doesn't break her grip, squeeze very gently just behind her nose/mouth area to unlatch her grip. Then give her a toy she can chew on. Over time, she should learn to play with her toys, and not your arms or hands.


